SAFETY TIPS TO ENSURE AN ENJOYABLE STAY

WATCH OUT FOR ATM FRAUD

- You do <u>NOT</u> need a permit to walk in the streets. IGNORE welldressed fraudsters who insist you need one, or any kind of permission to access a precinct. IT'S A SCAM!
- ATMs and wending machines inside food outlets do **NOT** issue permits of any kind.
- Do not hand over your bank card to anyone.
- Don't accept help from strangers cr disclose your PIN to anyone.
- If your card gets stuck or swallowed at an ATM, don't walk away. Follow the instructions given on the machine.

AVOID BEING PICKPOCKETED OR ROBBED

- Don't flash jewellery, cameras or laptops.
- Don't call or text from a cell phone in public.
- Don't leave handbags under tables or on the backs of chairs in restaurants.
- Don't leave your cell phone or wallet unattended on a restaurant table.

AVOID THEFT FROM YOUR VEHICLE

- Keep your valuables out of sight – put them in the boot BEFORE you start your trip.
- Always lock your doors and DOUBLE-CHECK the handles manually to avoid becoming a victim of remote jamming.
